Specific habitat creation or restoration secured through S106 and required to make the development acceptable:

"Specific habitat creation or restoration and their long-term management secured through S106 and required to make the development acceptable"

On-site provision of open space (or in the vicinity of the site) secured through S106 and required to make the development acceptable:

"On-site provision of open space (or in the vicinity of the site) and their long-term management secured through S106 and required to make the development acceptable"
