Assessment of hazards associated with loading/unloading and transporting tools to a site in a vehicle.

Tools	Head injury Puncture wounds Bruising Crushing	Driver Participant Public	Ensure tools are loaded safely in vehicle (lay large equipment flat/tie down anything that can become a projectile/place small hand tools in bags or boxes/ensure nothing can move into passenger area of vehicle/ensure heavy weights are evenly distributed); If tools are in open back of truck, ensure all are weighted down and use tarpaulin/ratchet straps if necessary; If more than one person is loading, ensure safe working distances to avoid collision; Wear gloves to protect hands from friction burns and blade cuts.	1	4	4	Driver Participant
Terrain	Slips, trips, falls	Driver Participant	Wear sensible, sturdy footwear when loading/unloading and ensure laces are tied; Plan loading route where access is easiest and least hazardous; Be aware of potholes in carparks and stumps/trip hazards around store entrances; Park vehicle as close as possible to tool store to avoid unnecessary distance with tools.	2	3	6	Driver Participant

	<b>If control measures are followed as described, risk factor is low enough to continue</b>
	<b>Hazard carries a moderate level of risk. Attempt to eliminate or isolate hazard; if this can't be done, decide whether task is essential and who is competent to ensure it is carried out safely. Additional control measures may be necessary</b>
	<b>Hazard is very high risk. Unless it can be isolated/eliminated, do not carry out task. Find alternative solution.</b>
